THE LORD'S DAY AT HOME.

If you are housebound or self-isolating at this time, please use this Gospel reading to unite yourself with the worship of the Universal Church, and your own Parish, this Sunday. If alone, read or say this Gospel reading quietly to yourself. If with another, or in a family, someone should read, and others respond. It might be suitable to find a special, quiet place at home for your Sunday prayers.

Gospel Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

Reflection

Mountains are strange places where remarkable things happen! In the first reading for Mass today we hear of the sacrifice of Abraham - on a mountain top! (see Genesis 22) In that story, which saw a new Covenant established between God and his chosen people, Abraham's son Isaac was spared and escaped sacrifice. Another hill was Calvary, but on that height someone's son did not escape. That was Jesus, revealed today as God's beloved Son in a moment of glory on another mountaintop. All this shows us the immensity of God's love - Father, Son and Spirit -willing to embrace the most profound sacrifice. There is so much more in this story - the appearance of Moses and Elijah, standing for the Law and the Prophets (the validation of the sacrifice of Jesus as fulfilment of the Old Testament); the confusion and fear of Saint Peter and his companions; but perhaps most important is the promise of the resurrection, when the glory glimpsed today is fully revealed. Our journey of Lent leads to glory - though it may sometimes feel like climbing a mountain! But remember, remarkable things happen on mountains!

Catholic Parliamentary Office – Scottish Child Payment has now started

The new benefit will give qualifying parents and carers £40 every four weeks for each child under six. The benefit has now started, meaning that Social Security Scotland is now able to do final eligibility checks and start issuing decisions. The first decisions and payments will arrive from late February. Thousands of applications are being processed each week to get money to families as soon as possible. People who applied in advance of Monday 15 February are expected to get a decision and, if eligible, their first payment by no later than the end of April. Payments for those who applied today or earlier will be calculated from today. Parents and carers who have not yet applied and have a child under six are encouraged to apply today to get the maximum amount of money they are entitled to. People who apply after today will have their payment calculated from the day that they apply. People, who supplied their mobile number, will be kept up to date on the progress of their application by text. Social Security Scotland delivers a number of benefits for families. This includes Best Start Grant Pregnancy and Baby Payment, Early Learning Payment, School Age Payment and Best Start Foods. Applications can be made for Scottish Child Payment and all of these using a single straightforward form. People can apply by visiting Benefits and grants - mygov.scot or calling 0800 182 2222. Scottish Child Payment is a new benefit and it is in addition to the UK wide Child Benefit.

† Bruised Apples

A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. Well, as such things go, one thing led to another. The sales meeting lasted longer than anticipated. Their flights were scheduled to leave out of Chicago's O'Hare Airport, and they had to race to the airport. With tickets in hand, they barged through the terminal to catch their flight back home. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table, which held a display of baskets of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly missed boarding, all but one. He paused, took a deep breath and experienced a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned. He told his friends to go on without him and told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the floor. He was glad he did. The 16-year-old girl at the apple stand was totally blind! She was softly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her, no one stopping or to care for her plight. The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them into the baskets, and helped set the display up once more. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket. When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$20 for the damage we did. Are you okay?" She nodded through her tears. He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly." As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister...." He paused and turned to look back into those blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?" He stopped in mid-stride, and he wondered. Then slowly he made his way to catch the later flight with that question burning and bouncing about in his soul: "Are you Jesus?" Do people mistake you for Jesus? That's our destiny, is it not? To be so much like Jesus that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life and grace. If we claim to know Him, we should live, walk and act as He would. Knowing Him is more than simply praying and going to church. It's actually living His life day by day. You are the apple of His eye even though we, too, have been bruised by the fall. He stopped what He was doing and picked you and me up on a hill called Calvary and paid for us in full.
